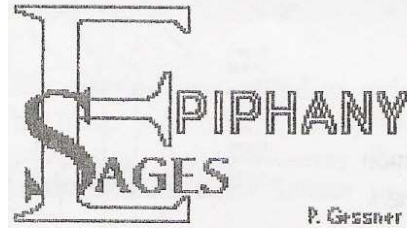
Core Team Meetings

Core Team Minutes: Aug 13, 2010

George Hagman convened the meeting at 12:00 noon. Those present: George Hagman, Marge McGrath, Carl Trimble, Mary Ann Calle, Sr. Mary, Dot Zipperle, Wilma Valentine, Dennis Keller, Suzanne Mosely, Mil and Norm Buckley, Freda Adiletto, Dianne Scheer, M. E. White and June and Ken Kellerman.

The **Opening Prayer** was by Wilma Valentine.

Report from Sr. Mary: At the July meeting, there were two separated tables. Several conversations were going on at the same time, instead of giving attention to the meeting. Sr. Mary said this showed no respect to the speaker. She also asked if corrections from the minutes were being passed on the general membership. It was noted that they were not. It was agreed that they should be, and would be henceforth. She also indicated some projects were being undertaken without consulting or advising her. She said that Dennis Keller came to her seeking information for the History of the Sages. She knew nothing of this. She suggested a committee of three (3) or four (4) to do the research, and pass it on to Dennis. She requested that she be a member of the committee. She noted that the Sages were not using inclusive language and should be.

The **minutes** for the July meeting were approved after the following corrections were made: April instead of June 2010 minutes. George Hagman should be deleted from Social Activities. In Sr. Mary's Report, Susan Mosley should have

been Suzanne Mosley. (Editor's note: some errors occur through poor editing which I accept as my errors. Some other "errors" may appear due to errors/omissions in content sent.)

Treasurer: Carl Trimble presented the first financial report for the 2010-2011 fiscal year. The Sages Parish budget for 2010-2011 is \$1410.00. Expenditures for the July-Aug period were \$196.01. There was no additional income for July-Aug., leaving a balance of available funds of \$1213.99. (NOTE the following correction: due to the return of a \$50 expenditure, the total expenses for the last fiscal year were \$2018.90. This left an UNSPENT balance of \$254.10 which will be retained by Epiphany Parish).

Hospitality: Dot Zipperle reported that Food from the Summer Picnic will be used for the August Meeting. Some desserts will be needed. Mary Ann Calle, M. E. White, Freda Adiletto, and Mil Buckley will bring desserts. June and Ken Kellerman will help in cleaning up.

Membership: Six (6) new members. (See the list below).

Newsletter: Items to be in the Newsletter should be sent to Joe Uveges by the Monday or Tuesday following the General Meeting. New members and deaths should be submitted to the appropriate committee(s) and subsequently sent to be published in the Newsletter.

Prayer Chain: Judith Ann Martin said no request for prayers for past three (3) months.

Program: Mil Buckley reminded all that the presenter for the August General Meeting was Angela Didyk. Suzanne Horgan, WLKY

Meteorologist, will be the speaker for the September meeting.

Social: Suzanne Mosley presented a list of upcoming activities for the Sages. They are listed in the "Upcoming Sages Activities Box found below. Also being considered are tours of the Churchill Downs Museum as well as the Cave Hill Cemetary.

Sunshine: Dennis Keller said two (2) cards were sent out since the July Meeting. A "thank you" note from Helen Deines was received and read.
